The New Hope Chief of Police, Michael Cummings, has confirmed that a “forced entry” also occurred in the neighboring Village 2 development.

A dark colored SUV Crossover was spotted in the area

The New Hope Police Blotter states:

### “RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES

January 19, 2013, at approximately 10:30 pm, two burglaries and one attempted burglary occurred in the Village II development. Police responded to an entry alarm at a unit on Belaire Ct. and discovered the front door kicked in setting the alarm off. Nothing was taken from this unit. Two other units in the same row on Belaire Ct. were discovered to have been entered. Entry was accomplished by breaking a window in one unit and forcing open a window in the second unit. One of the two units entered had some jewelry and small amount of cash taken. **Anyone noticing anything or anybody suspicious is asked to contact Cpl. Zimmerman at 215-862-3033”**

### **Crime Prevention - Food For Thought** from Det-Cpl Roy G. Ferrari

Check all exterior doors and windows for signs of prior damage or attempted forced entry. Do all exterior doors & windows locks work? Do you have keys for all doors?

Lock the door into house from the attached garage.

Do not leave expensive jewelry in jewelry box or dresser drawers. Decide on unique hiding place for your jewelry and use it.

Records safes are not for valuables or cash.

Money safe should be bolted in place, wheels removed or hidden from view.

Use your alarm system. Repair or adjust your alarm system, so that it fits your lifestyle.

Organize documents on valuable jewelry, photograph all jewelry, antiques, artwork, statuary.

Inventory list of items with serial numbers for entry into NCIC.

Ladder storage should include being locked in place.

Exterior lighting with motion detector. Interior lighting or talk radio on timer.

Surveillance camera system applications, IR camera, low lux, lens choice, hard drive capacity.

Lock your vehicles everywhere you go. Assess what you are leaving inside your vehicles.

Do not use your mailbox for outgoing mail.

Suspicious person, vehicles or occurrences should be reported to STPD in a timely fashion. Use 911 when it is important to you.

Use the camera in your cell phone to capture images of suspicious vehicle license plates or subjects.

Binoculars should be kept where you can use them. Paper & pencil to write things down.

Know where utility, cable and phone lines enter house, inspect for tampering.

NCIC and other investigative resources (JSA, ROLEX, NER, ALR) available when unique identifiers are available.

LOJACK for laptops.

Wireless routers should have encryption enabled (WEP, WPA, MAC address)

Know your neighbors, help each other, and own your community.
